Dick Bourgeois-Doyle is a writer and science administrator with an interest in innovation history, research ethics, and gender issues in technology. He recently retired from the position of Secretary General of the National Research Council of Canada (NRC) having previously been Director of Governance and Ethics. Before joining NRC in 1987, he served as Chief of Staff and Director of Communications to the Minister of Science and Technology, as Chief of Staff to the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans, and as a Legislative Assistant in the House of Commons as well as elected chair of the Parliamentary Assistants Assembly. A former broadcaster and journalist, he has written a number of books on science and innovation and contributed to many conferences, TV features, articles, and radio programs on the history of science in Canada. He chaired the NRC Centennial celebration (*100 Years of Innovation in Canada*) and is a three-time recipient of the *NRC Canada Outstanding Achievement Award for Public Awareness of Science*.

He has also served on a number of science ethics bodies, recently as a member of the International Council for Science - Committee on Freedom and Responsibility in the Conduct of Science; as a member of the Organizing Committee of the 3rd World Conference on Research Integrity, as Chair of the Universality of Science Thematic Session at the World Science Forum 2017, and as Chair of the Canadian Council on Animal Care (CCAC) Public Affairs and Communications Committee. Currently, he is a board member and interim Chair of the Foundation for Student Science and Technology, a member of the Advisory Board of the European *Path-2-Integrity* program, and a member of the Human, Social and Natural Sciences Sectoral Commission of the Canadian Commission for UNESCO.
